What technology do I need for the tournament?

- On Wednesday, March 2 — the day of the tournament — players will receive an email with the Zoom link and instructions to register on the poker platform, powered by [Poker4Life](#).
- The poker platform is accessed through your web browser — there is no software to download for this and no location restrictions. All you need is an internet connection to play! The platform works on desktop, laptop, tablet or cell for Mac or PC. However, a laptop or desktop is highly recommended for the best experience.
- During the event, you will need two internet browsers open simultaneously to access both the poker platform for the tournament and the Zoom link. Or you can play on your computer and Zoom on your cell phone.
- To have the most optimal event experience, please make sure you have the most recent version of Zoom. Download the latest version by clicking [here](#).

How do pre-paid rebuys work?

- If your ticket came with a discounted pre-purchased rebuy (included in the Ante Up or Royal Flush tickets) and you do not use it, it can also be used as an add-on instead.
- If you do not use your pre-purchased rebuy(s) it will be converted into a drawing ticket(s).

How do I purchase rebuys/add-on the night of the tournament?

- Any rebuys and/or add-on purchased the night of the event, beyond what was pre-purchased (if any), are \$300 each.
- During the game, there will be unlimited rebuys for the first 90 minutes of play.
- One add-on per person is allowed after the rebuy period ends.
- We do not store your credit card information. Any rebuys/add-on purchased the night of the event will be requested during the tournament break or invoiced post-event.

Please note, gambling rules and restrictions vary across the country. You will be playing with “play chips” during the tournament, which have no real cash value. Your participation in this event supports the acceleration of Parkinson’s research (and maybe some bragging rights, too) and your contribution is 100 percent tax deductible.
